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Are We Protecting Our Lakes? An editorial submitted by Lynne Saas, retiring PARCS Coordinator of Member Services

In 2001, more than 5,800 people in North Battleford and district became ill or were hospitalized when an infectious parasite seeped into their drinking water. The Commission of Inquiry appointed the finger at the City of North Battleford; they also alleged that the province's Environment Department was an "inadequate and ineffective" regulator. The **Water Security Agency (WSA)** was subsequently established to manage and protect **Source Water** in Saskatchewan. The WSA focused its efforts on several geographically affined watersheds. Each watershed was assessed as to the condition of its source water:

Over the next decade, with a coordinator and funding in place, these **Watershed Stewardship Groups** began educating their residents about source water protection. Despite having plans and programs in place, threats to our source water have continued. This is especially true for the threat of wetland drainage. Wetlands play a pivotal role in protecting and improving source water quality by acting as a natural filter and preventing pollution from reaching our lakes. Drainage of our wetlands, therefore, threatens to contaminate our lakes. Farmers have persisted in draining their wetlands with the goal of increasing the number of acres being farmed.

In the spring of 2023, PARCS learned that the province was withdrawing their funding and support for the watershed stewardship groups. The WSA has, instead, focused their attention on Ag-Water Management (farmland drainage) rather than Source Water Protection. The WSA claims that its new policy has the goal of protecting water quality and habitat while all the while not only retaining existing wetland drainage, but also allowing for new drainage. How this can be achieved remains to be seen. PARCS is one of the 70 stakeholders who have questioned these practices with the WSA.

The Provincial Association of Resort Communities of Saskatchewan represents 124 cottage mmunities in Saskatchewan. These communities are situated on dozens of sourcewater lakes, lakes that are a source: of drinking water, of recreation, of tourism, of wildlife habitat, of pleasure and fun. The 23 rural municipalities, 42 resort villages, and 59 organized hamlets that qualify for membership in PARCS hope to continue to be situated alongside waters that are clean and protected. How this will be achieved remains to be seen.
